and create	a parenthetical outline based on this person's life and legacy.

Format:

- Cover page with image of your historical figure (see example)
- Parenthetical outline (see example)
- Works cited page (see example)
- This entire assignment must be typed, double spaced, 11 point font, Arial

Required Sources: 3 total sources

- 1 print source (reference book, encyclopedia, or a book on your figure)
- 1 Electronic source (electronic: database, Ebooks) NO WEBSITES of any kind!
- 1 primary source!
- Use MLA format for your works cited (MLA 8) using NoodlTools (you can use more than 3 sources)

Outline Basics:

Your outline will need to cover the following areas of your person's life:

- 1. Early life (birth, family life, education, career/occupations)
- 2. Progressive Reform (use your primary source here)
- 3. Legacy (what did that person do that impacts American society today)

See the outline examples for clarification on what to cover

Directions for the outline:

- First letter of every new bullet should be capitalized
- Any information you gained from a source should be in complete sentences AND cited on the outline (see example outline)

Citation of Sources in the Outline:

Works Cited Page:

- Alphabetical order based on the 1st word of each citation
- Double-spaced
- Do NOT add an extra space between each source
- Hanging indent = 1st line of each source should NOT be indented, all lines after that for the source need to be indented (see example)
