Treaty of Versailles, 1919 Overview

- Who was there: "Big Four": U.S., France, Great Britain, Italy
- Not invited: Germany, Austria-Hungary, Russia
- **Fourteen Points**—U.S. President Wilson's plan for peace (most of it not included)
 - Desired an association that would protect nations
- Britain & France wanted to punish Germany
