AP World History Research Paper

Do you want to know a fun fact? A research paper is just a DBQ where you, the student, get to choose your prompt. Amazing, I know. © You are about to partake in the process of writing your own DBQ using a topic of that you are interested in.

Topic:

Pick a major event, battle, idea that we have covered or will cover in AP World History that was/or could have been a turning point in world history. Your paper should answer the question below.

Basic Requirements:

- 1. At least 4-6 sources (you can have more than this)
- 2. Typed outline with parenthetical documentation
- 3. Typed Research Paper (3-5 pages)

Sources: 4-6 sources

- 1 print source
- 1 database article (ie. Gale, ABC-CLIO,...)
- All other sources may be electronic: database. Ebooks. websites
 - YOU MAY NOT USE Wikipedia or any other non-academic sources!!!! Sources must be reliable-published by a credible and valid author or organization. If you use these non-academic sources—they will not count towards the required sources and will result in possible failure of research portion of the grade.)
- At least 1 quote from a PRIMARY SOURCE—ask for help
- Use MLA format to cite each in Noodle Tools.

Research Paper Format:

- Cover Page (see format on my website)
- Essay
 - Well-written, unified, analytical essay, including an introduction, thesis and topic sentences, and a conclusion paragraph
 - o **3-5 pages,** double spaced (excluding your cover page & works cited page)
 - 11 point font—Arial (no BOLD lettering)
 - o 1 inch margins (this is the "normal" setting—do NOT make it bigger) or less
 - Left justified, NEVER CENTER
 - Check for proper capitalization.
 - PROOFREAD YOUR PAPER!!! Have someone else also read it and make corrections.
 - Citations—are required for ALL INFORMATION that would not be considered common knowledge.

Example: Julius Caesar was assassinated.—no citation

On March 15, 44 C.E. Julius Caesar was assassinated by a group of Roman senators for fear of this growing power. The conspirators stabbed him 23 times while in the midst of the Roman senate (Whiting 40).

Parenthetical citations = (Last name page number).
Example: (Smith 249).
Period is after the citation, outside of the parentheses.

- Works Cited Page
 - o Eliminate ALL HYPERLINKS for digital sources!
 - Alphabetical order (Do NOT count "the" in the title)
 - Hanging indent
- Essay DON'TS:
 - Never start the essay with a quote! It needs context.
 - o Don't ask the reader questions, even rhetorical ones! This is for the entire paper.
 - Don't quote very often!! It just makes it look like you are filling in space. Instead, paraphrase and cite. ONLY 4-5 quotes TOTAL in your paper.
 - No quote over FOUR lines!!!

Research Paper Organization:

- I. Introduction paragraph:
 - a. Contextualization (just like you do for a normal LEQ or DBQ—3-4 sentences to set the stage for your topic with background)
 - i. You can use quotes/paraphrases from your sources here
 - b. Thesis sentences (MUST answer "to what extent" To what extent was _____ (your topic) a turning point in world history?)
 - At least 3 main points (one of them MUST be supporting the opposite view: example 2 points supporting the fall of Rome as a turning point and one point explaining how it was NOT a turning point)
- II. Body paragraphs (3)
 - a. In order of points in thesis
 - b. Cite evidence from sources (correct MLA format) to support each of your thesis points
 - c. Last point should be the opposing view
 - d. Sourcing of at least 1 of your documents (SAPP)—should be when you use your PRIMARY SOURCE QUOTE!!!! (See my example)
- III. Conclusion
 - a. Brings some sort of closure—can be a restatement of thesis
