


#### Preface to Exploration




#### **Purpose of Exploration**

- Purpose: gold, glory, and God
- Gold—desire for wealth
  - Main reason
  - Spices (nutmeg, cinnamon, ginger, pepper) & luxury goods from Asia
- Glory
  - Men looking for fame as explorers
  - Nations wanting to improve their status
- God
  - Believed they had a duty to spread Christianity to world

# Map from 1400s, when people spread rumors of sea monsters and shipwreck





#### **Consider the facts:**


- you have no idea what is out there
